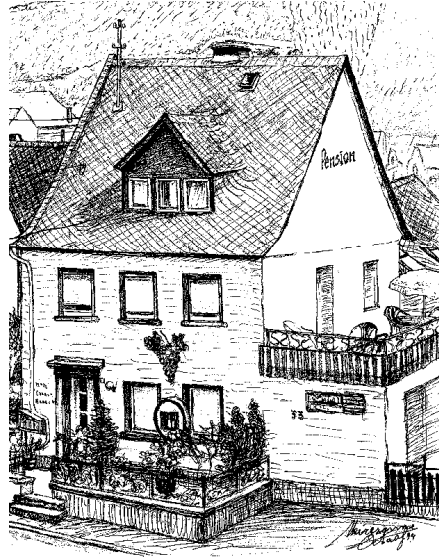


WEINGUT H.J. & E. LEHMEN

Our top priority is to supply our customers with authentic and honest wines. We respect the environment and strive to preserve nature.

Our wines are grown in the romantic town of Zell/Mosel, the wine city of the famous "Zeller Schwarze Katz" (The black cat) in the middle of a 2000 year old countryside in the heart of the mid-Moselle valley.

All the vineyard work during the year is done by hand to guarantee that every single grape vine will be handled with the utmost of care to keep them in top condition. All of our wines are cold fermented.

2007 Kerner Qualitätswein 2006 vintage – 90pts, W.E.

Harvesting Time : 10/3/2007
Alc: 9.5 %
Residual Sugar : 75g/l
Acidity : 7.4 g/l

Very light and easy drinking wine with a lot of fruitiness and intense sweetness.
Reminiscent of Mirabelle, Kiwi fruit and Honey Melon.

2006 Zeller Schwarze Katz, Riesling Hochgewächs 86pts, W.E.

Harvesting Time : mid of October
Alc: 9,0%
Residual Sugar : 40g/l
Acidity: 9 g/l

A light and refreshing wine with nice sweetness.
Juicy and fruity with flavors of Peach, green apple and woodruff.

2006 Zeller Schwarze Katz, Riesling Hochgewächs Halbtrocken (medim dry)

Harvesting Time : mid of October
Alc.: 11,0 %
Residual Sugar : 17 g/l
Acidity : 8,5 g/l

A very refreshing and crisp Riesling.
Reminiscent of Citrus Fruits and Apple, and a typical, mineral slate note.
